Just wanted to share this article by Jim Cymbala, Pastor of Brooklyn Tabernacle Church in New York City.

"The Holy Spirit is underappreciated and under preached by the twenty-first century church. A sort of prejudice against the Holy Spirit impedes many from learning more about him. In fact, the body of Christ is often divided into two sides. One side stresses the Word of God, separating itself from what it views as the emotional fanaticism often linked to those emphasizing the work of the Holy Spirit. The other side is sometimes known for drifting into unbiblical manifestations and unorthodox teaching while attributing it all to the Spirit of God.

Seeing the abuse and bad teaching, many on the first side will say, "I'm not interested in experiences and manifestations of the Holy Spirit. I just want to study the Word." But it was the Holy Spirit who inspired the Bible, and there are lots of promises concerning his person and work. How can anyone treasure God's Word without giving the Holy Spirit his rightful place?

Those who move in circles strongly emphasizing the Holy Spirit must be reminded that *everything* must be tested by scripture. The Spirit never contradicts the Word he gave us. He also never puts the focus on the preacher because the Holy Spirit was sent to glorify Christ alone (John 16:14).

CONGREGATIONAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

JUNE 13, 2021

CALL TO ORDER AND PRAYER: In the absence of Dwight Roetta (Moderator), Sharon Moore, Board Chair, called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

PROPOSED POLITY CHANGE: Strike the sentence in Sec 6.2.C stating "The Office Secretary shall be hired from outside the congregation in order to protect the integrity and privacy of the church office." Removal of this sentence will allow more flexibility in filling the position and it was agreed that integrity of the church office is not compromised by hiring from within the congregation.

Motion made and seconded on this proposed change.

No discussion. Vote taken and passed, unanimously.

CHURCH SECRETARY POSITION RECOM-MENDATION: Interim Secretary, Teresa Beard, was recommended to fill the position on a permanent basis.

Motion made and seconded on this recommendation.

No discussion. Vote taken and passed, unanimously.

PROPOSED SALARY PACKAGE FOR CHURCH SECRETARY POSITION: New Secretary would be offered the current salary package in the budget, with the rate based on market for a part–time position.

Motion made and seconded on this proposal.

Discussion: would individual be eligible for annual raises? Yes, usually based on District guideline recommendations.

Vote taken and passed, unanimously.

OTHER BUSINESS:

**Dwight Roetta has contacted White Hill, stepping down from his role as Moderator due to health reasons and other demands on his schedule. Sharon announced the board will begin a search for his replacement. White Hill congregation would like to express our sincere appreciation to Dwight for his service in the role.

**Donation of playground equipment update:
Out of 3 area churches considered, White Hill is
the recipient of used commercial—grade playground equipment through an outside source.
The donor has requested a donation, of our
discretion, be given to LovelNC in lieu of payment. Equipment was disassembled and delivered to White Hill at the end of May, with much
thanks to Tyler Meadows, who volunteered to
take on that project. The Stewards Commission
will lead the set-up of the equipment with assistance from Tyler and other volunteers. A possible completion date for this project could be as
early as August 2021.

The Board recommended a donation of \$5000 be given to LoveINC. Debbie Ramsey will be working with the Board of LoveINC on where best to designate this donation.

**Sharon Moore stated that there's more to come for White Hill's blessings of LovelNC and other ministries. We receive abundant blessings from the Lord through others and we, in turn, bless others out of our abundance. We have been supportive of organizations in our area such as ACE Co-Op and LovelNC and the Lord continues to bless us in return. It's a cycle of giving and giving abundantly. Continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to work in our lives and our church and lead us as to how we can bless other ministries.


